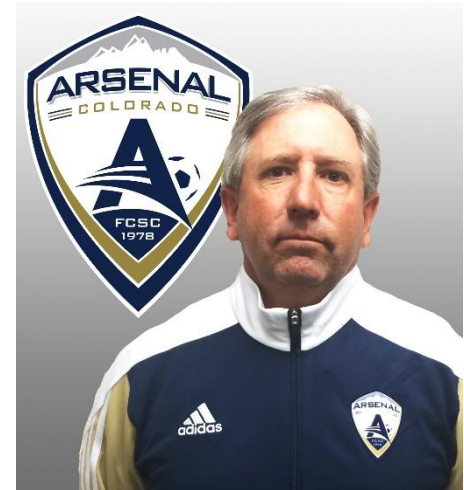

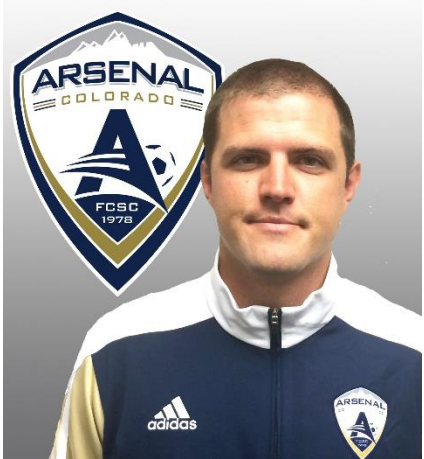

- Identify and *group* players of like ability

Benefit of grouping by ability?

- Enhances player development and overall experience!



Multiple teams per age group

- Allows for players to develop at their own rate physically & emotionally
- Earn promotion with level of team & level of competition
- Allows for players to train/play “up”
- Always a higher level team and competition

Player Evaluation Criteria



- Technical Abilities (dribble, pass, shoot)
- Tactical Awareness (decision-making)
- Athleticism (speed, fitness, agility)
- Psychology (attitude, competitiveness)

- Coaches meet for player placement directly after their final tryout
- Coaches contact their players by phone!
- All player notifications will be made within a week of their respective tryouts

League Structure



Champions League (seeded by historical data)

Premier 1, Premier 2, Premier 3

Promotion & Relegation occur between seasons

Centennial League (club placement)

Elite, Platinum, Gold, Silver, Bronze

No Promotion & Relegation; club places team each season



Year : 18 games

- 9 in the Fall / 9 in the Spring
- Half games at home (Complex) and half away
- “Away” may be anywhere in Colorado

Fall Season

- Begins August 28th
- Ends early November

Spring Season

- Begins mid-March (you will play games over spring break)
- Ends mid-May

Tournament Information



- Most teams play in 3 tournaments during the seasonal year (Fall/Spring)
- U11 teams typically travel within Colorado for tournaments; Academy and Gold teams may travel out-of-state

Training Programs



- Staff Training with individual teams
- Friday Night Tech Nights
- Weekly Goalkeeper Training
- Game and Tournament Support
- Winter/Summer Academies

Player Expenses



- **Exact amount:** determined by the team coach and parents as part of the process of forming and approving the team's annual financial statement.
- **Total fees include:** costs for registration, practice space, equipment, uniforms, clinics, tournaments, social activities, and coaches expenses.

Player Fees (due to Club)



- 2021/22 registration fees for U11: (payment plan options available)
 - Academy \$1,395 / year
 - Gold \$1,245 / year
 - Royal, Blue, White, Black \$1,135 / year
- Uniforms: (team price – Adult \$275/Youth \$265 + tax)
 - Required – 2 jerseys, 2 shorts, 2 socks, 1 training jersey
 - Optional – warm-ups, backpack, training short
- Fee and uniforms scholarship available to qualified players
- In the past 5 years more than \$270,000 has been awarded in scholarships

Player Fees (due to Club)



Fees cover...

- Club Registration
- Colorado Soccer Association fees
 - Games / referees / insurance
- Training Programs
- Coaches Stipend (pay)
- Club Overhead
- Soccer Complex field maintenance / prep

Player Fees (due to team)



Fees due to the team:

- Tournament Entry Fees
- Team coach reimbursements
- Team equipment
- Social activities
- Team Snap
- Practice space

Yearly AVERAGE: Academy: \$400

Gold: \$300

Royal, Blue, White: \$200
